

Swine fever eradicated at South Korean farm

Pig farm reported to have 4 cases of classical swine fever has been disinfected and all susceptible animals have been destroyed

A South Korean pig rearing farm that had four cases of classical [swine fever](#) is now free of the disease, the [World Organisation for Animal Health](#) (OIE) reported on December 10. OIE initially reported the South Korean swine fever outbreak on November 28.

Four animals at a pig farm were confirmed to have swine fever in South Korea, but no deaths were reported as a result of swine fever. An additional 296 pigs were susceptible. All 300 of the animals were destroyed.

After control measures including stamping out, quarantine, movement control within the country, screening, vaccination and disinfection of the property, the farm is now declared free of swine fever, the OIE reported.
